• Five-week experience focused on the management of acutely and critically ill patients which included offering recommendations for medication changes, nutrition supplementation, transferring to different levels of care, and specific lab values to collect and monitor. Other projects included calculating vancomycin doses and frequency, determining the corrected vancomycin trough level, and documenting any appropriate vancomycin dose adjustments. Medication reconciliation was completed with patients in the ICU each day, as well as rounds with other healthcare professionals in the unit. The rotation offered several opportunities to interact with other pharmacists within the hospital, such as attending meetings and presentations as well as shadowing the infectious disease clinical pharmacist.
